(1) Strike extent on 81v.1 — TWO separate strike zones, not one:

- **Zone A (line start, L-b1):** first ink of the line is a STRUCK cluster, ~5–7 letters, possibly two short tokens (strike runs continuously; letter-skeleton under strike not nat-legible — candidates include "~~were~~" one-word and a two-token "~~←→~~o~~←→~~re" parse). **eB QUEUED (eB-81v-1).** Line 1's first ink sits at leaf-x ≈ 0.31–0.33 — INDENTED relative to what lines below appear to use; measure text-block left edge against b2–b8 lines before assigning meaning *[[flag: indent-vs-strike-zone-A geometry]]*.
- **Zone B (mid-line, R-b1):** ONE word struck, ~5 letters, skeleton ⟨L⟩ewes-class — initial tall looped majuscule (L-class, cf. 81r.21 "Lewes"), then e-w-e-s minim/bowl run under a single horizontal strike. **△** names-class → **eB QUEUED (eB-81v-2)** regardless of confidence (wish-fulfilment guard: "Lewes" is the *expected* token from the survey hypothesis — letterforms only).

(2) Interline anchor (R-b1): «hugh ap» sits interlined ABOVE strike-zone B, its "hugh" beginning directly over the struck word; a small **caret Λ** at baseline immediately after the struck word, before "William". After "ap" a short diagonal stroke — virgule-like; could be the caret's lead-line or a separator *[[unresolved, eB-81v-2 to check]]*. Big descender loop below the strike zone = tail from strike-return or line-2 ascender interference, NOT part of the caret *[[lean]]*.

(3) Parse (only now): 81v.1 nat reading: ⟨??⟩ well knowne to ~~Lewes~~Λ«hugh ap» William⟨—⟩ = — corrected sense "...well knowne to hugh ap William⟨—⟩".
